




DEPUTY GRAND KNIGHT APRIL'S MESSAGE

This past month I stumbled upon a copy of our council's 20th anniversary book published in 2011. I did not even know we had published a book. After reading it, I genuinely want to thank the 2010-2011 council for having the foresight to publish such a book. It is full of our council's histo-

ry including it's very origin and as a number of timeless photographs. It also contains special memories from many of our past Grand Knights written in their own words.



Not just for Knights of Columbus, but for any organization, to have a successful future, that organization needs to know their past. I encourage every one of our members to seek a copy of this pearl of great price, to understand just how we as a council got to where they are today. Consider

asking our senior members to see if they have a copy that you may borrow. In the meantime, I will share with you some memories contained in the book, written by a few of our past Grand Knights.



In 1991, sixteen St. Joseph's parishioners joined eighteen already existing Knights and formed the St. Joseph's-Knights of Columbus Council #10644. Herb Saska was selected to be the very first Grand Knight of our council. Herb recalled the struggles that came with being a new council. One of the first pressing issues was developing a "Degree Team" that could quickly be certified so that they could start ushering in new members. They created "Knight Light" newsletter to

keep their members informed on council activities. (you can still see the Knightlite from 2010 to present on our website) As a new council they needed a source of income, other than the annual dues, just to survive. Father O'Hare turned over to the Knights the running of the annual St. Joseph's Golf Tournament, and between the golf tournament and their breakfasts, the council was on it's way to becoming financially solvent.
