JULY'S LECTURER REPORT







Greetings Brothers;

July is here, it is a new Columbian Year and we welcome our new officers. We also welcome some new members at our last meeting. Even though we were at the JPII Center and a little out of our element, it was a fantastic meeting. Lots of familiar faces and some new faces as well. I hope to see you at our next gathering, we will be back in the Father O'Hare Hall. Due to Independence Day falling on the first Tuesday of the month, our meeting will be a week later on July 11,2023 @ 7:00pm.

During the month of July, we celebrate and honor the precious Blood of Jesus here are some things that we can do with our families during July to honor and stay close to his precious Blood.

1) Spend time in Adoration. We can focus on the presence of the Blood of Christ in the Holy Eucharist. During adoration, we can do our part to console the tears of Blood that Christ shed in Gethsemane. We can be the friends who stay by his side throughout His passion.

2) Receive Communion and not just on Sunday's. Consider going to daily mass as much as you can this month. When we receive His Body, of course we always receive His Blood. Pack up the family and head to Saint Joseph's for the morning or the evening mass to get your daily bread! (Morning mass commences at 8:00am and evening mass at 5:45pm).

3) Pray the Divine Mercy chaplet regularly this month. "But when they came to Jesus and saw that he was already dead, they did not break his legs, but one soldier thrust his lance into His side, and immediately Blood and Water flowed out". John 19:33-34. The Devine Mercy Chaplet recalls the moment of Christ Passion. On Fridays at 3 o'clock the hour of Mercy in the Adoration Chapel at our Parish, we pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy and ask that the Precious Blood of Jesus wash away our sins.

Saint Longinus, the Centurion who pierced the side of our Lord, while he was hanging on the cross, is said to have healed of blindness as the Blood and Water from the side of Jesus fell into his eyes, How great is our Lord that He heals a guy that stabs him!?

Saint Catherine of Siena invites us to join her in her "Constant" prayer:

Precious Blood, ocean of Divine Mercy: Flow upon us!

Precious Blood, most pure, offering: Procure us every grace!

Precious Blood, hope and refuge of sinners: atone for us!
Precious Blood, delight of holy souls: draw us!
Amen.
