



Grand Knight's Message

My dear Brother Knights,
"Inconsistency on the part of pastors and the faithful between what they say and what they do, between word and manner of life, is undermining the Church's credibility." – Pope Francis.

One may change this to be read as, *"Inconsistency on our part as Brothers in fraternity, unity and charity between what we say and what we do, between word and manner of life, is undermining the Knights' credibility."*

Are these harsh words or words of truth for more than one of us - myself included? As of late, there has been much grumbling and complaining about various events that have not been completed or lacked chairs or have not contained the proper amount of enthusiasm (according to some). It is often difficult for some to give "control" to another; to stand by

and watch something you cherished changed – whether neutral or even when it is for the good; to feel criticized, judged or even condemned. These feelings are rarely spoken by another, but often only perceived in our own minds. It is dangerous territory and certainly not of God. While it is good to review past years and means of completing events and meetings for their wisdom and guidance, we must remember it is just that, guidance. Change is good for us, and new members or old members approaching things with new ideas keeps us from becoming stagnate. Our primary mission is to provide service to St. Josephs' and the larger community. The Knights of Columbus has been called "the strong right arm of the Church," and has been praised by Popes, Presidents and other world leaders for its support of the Church,

programs of evangelization, civic involvement and aid to those in need. I am asking myself, and humbly request you do the same, if I truly embody this duty. Each of us has a very clear order of priority concerning the things we consider important. Fr. McGivney understood this in an intricate way but also knew that our lives were on a path that must be led solely by Our Lord, for it was He that invited us on this journey, He that chose us. We can only serve Him and proclaim and witness for Him if we have a close relationship with Him. As a Knight, how do I bear witness to Christ through my faith? Do I have the grace and fidelity of Mary to offer a silent and strong "Fiat" (yes) and the courage of the apostles to say "Fiat voluntas tua" (Thy will be done)? Jesus said "the last shall be first," so it follows that those who are above (and I place Brothers in the Knights of Columbus in this fortunate group) must be in service to others. This doesn't mean that we ignore our own

Happy New Year! I suppose




everyone's New Year resolution somehow would ultimately be to find greater happiness for oneself and for others. The only way to be really

I experience more joy in my own life when I am more faithful to prayer and intimacy of love with God and neighbor. C.S. Lewis says that, ironically, the people who are happiest in this life are the ones who will be happy forever in heaven, and the people who end up in hell forever are also miserable in this life. They lack the deep down joy and peace of being in a state of grace in this life. Mortal sins in particular are the best way to be unhappy. I am convinced of

this. I think we all are. Those who are slaves of sin are no longer free to enjoy the simple pleasures of life. Those who are addicted become distracted from that which makes us most happy: wholesome relationships with God and neighbor. And the objects of mortal sin aren't so great. The lust addict becomes unsatisfied unless there is always something new and more intense.

My dear Brother Knights, There are some changes coming about in our Council. Some of them are obvious, like receiving this newsletter in a new 21st century format or at least in color (for those that do not prefer email). Others are not positive, like loosing some of our Officers due to moves or work obligations taking them to other areas. Others are not either obvious or negative, but they are happening. Here are some of them. First of all, many of you have noticed that we have not been as successful in some of our events as we have been in past years. There are a couple of different ways of looking at what is happening. The first is to point fingers and blame others for not "doing things right." That is one possible way of looking at any situation, but it does not provide either a solution to the problem or live up to the principles that our order holds (it is not charitable nor fraternal). Besides, those of us who have been involved over the past few years have noticed that attendance at some of our events has been dropping over those same years. It might be more visible in some of the recent events, but only because it has reached a more visible

level.

I am sure that most of you are familiar with the old definition of insanity, right? Insanity is where you keep doing the same thing but expecting a different result. We have done some things exactly the same way and expected a different result. One example of that is "our" annual golf tournament. Four years ago, we, as an entire Council, saw that the tournament was attracting fewer people. So, what did we do? We promoted it the next year in the exact same way and wondered, why are there fewer people? We tried the next year and couldn't get anyone to sign up. So what did we do? We canceled it at the last second and tried exactly the same last year. This year, as Officers, we made the decision to not even try to promote it, but to work with the parish for next year to move it back to where it started originally, as a parish wide event. We need to stop trying to do things like we have always done with our Council. A business which never changes with the new realities is going to stagnate, so is our Council if we don't change. We need to set up goals, make projections (for funds raised and for recruitment), and set up plans of how we are reach those goals (getting rid of what has proven not to work in the past).

The first step of moving towards a more successful Council is to decide on a vision. The Officers and other key Brothers are going to meet in early January to draft a vision for at least the next six months. The results of that discussion will be shared in this newsletter and at the Business Meeting. Our hope is that we can continue to build off of the great past success of this Council with new strategies, new members and new ideas. We look forward to working with all of you to do that, as it will require something from all of us.



Lecturer's Notes: January: Are You Ready?!

"The Spirit and the bride say, 'Come.' Let the hearer say, 'Come.' Let the one who thirsts come forward, and the one who wants it receive the gift of life-giving water. I warn everyone who hears the prophetic words in this book: if anyone adds to them, God will add to him the plagues described in this book, and if anyone takes away from the words in this prophetic book, God will take away his share in the tree of life and in the holy city described in this book. The one who gives this testimony says, 'Yes, I am coming soon.' Amen! Come, Lord Jesus! The grace of the Lord Jesus be with all.—Rev. 22: 17-21 This reading is taken from the book of Revelation. This book is attributed to John who was the last apostle to die. The canon of the Bible was officially closed when the last apostle died; and no other writings were considered "inspired." John is significant, because he was one of the original 12. He lived among Jesus, Mary his mother, and all of the other apostles and disciples; and he knew all of these people personally. Additionally, John saw Jesus change water to wine, cure lepers, and raise the dead among other spectacular miracles. John's words are credible; they are addressed to his contemporaries as well as us today. This passage

forms the very last four verses of the Bible. Of all the host of stories and miracles, genres and histories, this is the passage that God wants to leave you with.

This is the taste He wants to leave on your tongue. In summary, John is saying, "Hurry back, Lord." God's reply is, "I'll be back soon." Jesus is a departing lover who promises to return to his beloved and right all wrongs. And He will. This is like the part of the movie where my wife reaches for the Kleenex, loves promise fulfilled.

Again, our Catholic faith leads from the front when we celebrate Advent each year. We spend the last four weeks of each year preparing with eager anticipation for the return of our Lord. The Church picks up right where the Bible leaves off and in doing so she takes us, the faithful, right into the story. Now I want the Kleenex. Advent is now upon us. Not only is this the season of the last four verses of the Bible, but it is the beginning of the liturgical year. **HAPPY LITURGICAL NEW YEAR !!!** Since Advent of 2012, the Church has proclaimed the Gospel of St. Luke; and from now until next December, we will hear the Gospel of St. Matthew. During this season of preparation for the coming of the Lord, we prepare to encounter him through our prayer life, in the Mass, at the end of our lives, and at the end of time. We have lots of opportunity to encounter Jesus and we must always be

prepared. He will hold us accountable. This is a great time to make a good confession. As a special treat for this Advent Season, members of this Council will be leading the Respect Life rosary on Friday, December 13th after the 5:45 PM Mass. Please, plan to attend as we raise our voice in unison to bring about the end of abortion. Also, the Advent Mission this year is December 8-12, and will be led by Fr. Wade Menezes, the topic: "Reality Check – The Four Last Things." Have a wonderful Advent and a very Merry Christmas! See you at Mass.
