CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

My dear Brother Knights, The saddest thing I read in the newspaper this past year was back in May, and I can't forget it. A study found that four in ten households with children now have the mother as the sole or primary earner for her family. This means that in 40% of families the mother is the main breadwinner! (New York Times, May 29, 2013) The question that comes to my mind is "Where are all the men?"

More and more children are growing up without a father figure. This will result in more and more young men growing up not knowing how to be a father, how to be a man. Many more young men experience a hunger for the father's love which can trigger same-sex attraction. And the vicious cycle will continue. If you are looking for "a few good men" to be Marines, husbands, priests, or Knights, it will become increasingly difficult.

The problem is that most men are unarmed and undisciplined and therefore unable to fight against the evils that threaten our families in this cultural war. But there is a secret weapon that can be used for training, strengthening and

empowering good men. We need to be armed with the *rosary*.

After World War II this secret weapon was promoted by "The Rosary Priest," Father Patrick Peyton (1090-1992). This Irish priest started the "Family Rosary Crusade" which organized massive rosary rallies in major cities of the world. Between 1958 and 1965 his Rosary Rallies in South America were actually supported and funded by the CIA as a "weapon" to combat leftist influence during the Cold War! Fr. Peyton was famous for his slogan: "The Family that prays together stays together!" Fr. Peyton was famous for attracting enthusiastic support for his work from celebrities, Hollywood stars, and even presidents! Fr. Peyton was also befriended by the renowned scholar Marshall McLuhan (1911-1980), a Canadian philosopher of communication theory who was famous for coining the expressions "the medium is the message" and "global village." Marshall McLuhan predicted the World Wide Web almost thirty years before the internet was invented! He was raised protestant, became an agnostic during his university studies but eventually converted

to Catholicism after reading Chesterton.

Fr. Patrick Peyton did a television interview with Marshal McLuhan in which they discussed the value of the rosary. McLuhan gave a beautiful explanation of the value of the rosary based on his academic studies. He said that in our world of instant communication and "sound bites," there is often superficial understanding of important matters. McLuhan explained that human mind benefits from the repetition in the rosary which provides an ongoing "re-cognition" of important messages and therefore a "perpetual deepening" of understanding. 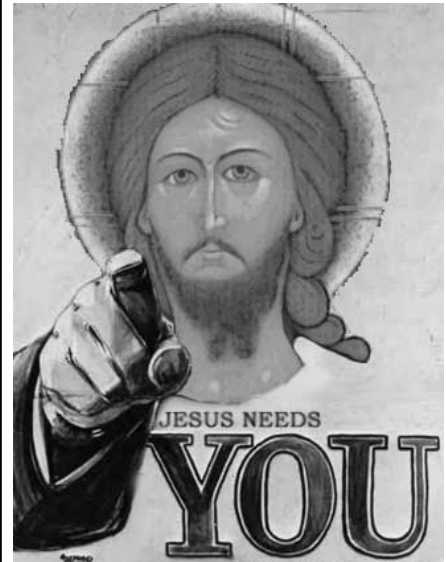

Lecturer's Notes: October: Fidelity and Rewards

"Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, a descendant of David: such is my gospel, this saying is trustworthy:

If we have died with him we shall also live with him; if we persevere, we shall also reign with him. But if we deny him he will deny us. If we are unfaithful he remains faithful, for he cannot deny himself."

2 Timothy 2: 11-13 (from the 2nd reading – Sunday October 13, 2013)

Autumn is always a busy time for everyone: little children bring home artwork that will become keepsake, big children grumble about assignments, crisp mornings, first rains, short days, football season and sales at every store. I love autumn!

Autumn is also the final political campaign season which made me think about this and similar scripture passages. While driving to Mass this morning I noticed campaign signs at major intersections on the way. Hmmm, there must be an election coming and someone must want my vote. I hear that when you inherit a lot of money you get a lot of friends and relatives who didn't pay you any mind in the past. Likewise, in an election year, you hear a lot of promises from people who

forget all about you when they are in office.

The passage above, as well as campaign promises are really about fidelity. Fidelity is another word for faithfulness or loyalty. Are we faithful to our word, do we keep our promises? Do we persevere in the promises of our baptism?

R. I do.

V. Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting?

R. I do.

V. God, the all-powerful Father of our Lord Jesus Christ has given us a new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, and forgiven all our sins.

May he also keep us faithful to our Lord Jesus Christ for ever and ever.

R. Amen.
