
- we need YOU. I dream that you will step forward and attend the meetings and be present more often. (give more to your Knights of Columbus Council #10644).



CHAPLAIN'S JUNE MESSAGE

Brothers,

As we are coming to the end of the Columbian year with changes of Officers and Shelter in Place still ... in place, I feel called to write about prayer, especially family prayer. I do so, because we all took a promise when we received our rosary from the Knights to pray it as often as possible. You all know what that means for most of us, we pray when we get around to it, right?

"Yeah, I'll pray right after the game." Or right after the new, or the movie, or whatever else is distracting us. Prayer, unfortunately for many of us, even now when there are not any games, some are not traveling as much for work, and there should be more opportunities is not always as high as it should be. What we tend to forget is that prayer is our way of developing our relationship with God. It is not something that just the priests, deacons, and nuns do, it is something that we should all do, as we all need a deep relationship with our Creator.

Imagine, if you will, what would happen with the relationship we have with our wives if we never spoke with them. Yes, I realize that some of your wives might be happier with that set up, but, even if so, it would not be much of a relationship, would it? And what about your friends? Would they consider you a friend if you only infrequently communicated with them, and even then only when you needed something? Our relationship with God is the same. We need to communicate with Him as well.

In the same manner, our communication with God should be a priority. I know that we all do tell our wives, "Just a minute, wait for the game/movie/work is done," before we communicate with them. But, what do your wives think about that response. Similarly, if you are not

married or do not want to make that comparison, how would your friends react if they were trying to communicate with you, and you kept pushing off for a game, a movie, or something else that really could wait? God is really the same way. He is communicating with us all the time, even when we are not paying enough attention to realize or to "hear" what He is saying to us.

Communication is important for all relationships. If others, whether God, our families, our brother Knights, or whoever are truly important, we should be communicating with them. Yes, communication is difficult at times. Men and women communicate in very different manners (remember the book Men are from Mars, Women are from Venus?). God also communicates in a manner that is very different from us (Isaiah 55:8-9). What I have learned in all of my training (work and in formation), is that many of the times, the problem is not what the other person is saying. It is more in how I am expressing my side of the conversation or in how I am understanding what the other person is saying.

What we all need to ask ourselves is: are we doing our part to deepen our relationship with God? Are we praying daily? Are we pursuing God? Or are we just waiting around?

Yes, those are all difficult questions. They become difficult when we add in the importance of praying with our families. Even if we are praying on a regular basis (1 Thessalonians 5:17), getting our family to pray with us, even part of them, is difficult. Those of you with younger children have an advantage as a lot of it has to do with creating habits. It is hard with those of us with older children to create new habits when we

did not do so when they were more likely to listen. That does not mean that we should not try, even when it is difficult. I have one 27 year old who reminds me about praying together and a 30 year old with whom it is a struggle to get him to pray with us, even though he is still living at home. We do not give up, however, and continue to invite, cajole, and encourage him to join us.

The ball is in your court now. Are you going to deepen your relationship with God? Are you going to increase your prayers? Are you going to invite your family to join?

LECTURER'S JUNE MESSAGE

"Being Handicapped" (Editorial by Leonard E. Churilla)

Being handicapped gives one a whole different perspective on life. I did not realize until years later how difficult it can be to perform certain tasks and how frustrating it can be trying to do them, In elementary school I did not pay much attention to kids I saw in wheel chairs, or struggling on crutches to get around. As my mother got older and had problems with her knees, she eventually had to use a four-pronged cane to get around. I watched her climb steps slowly in agony in what seemed like forever. It was just something I thought only "old people" had to deal with. Mom used to say, "You'll get yours someday son".

On special occasions at grandma's house back in Detroit, it was kind of comic watching all my aunts and uncles gathered around grandma's dining table trying to top one another with complaints about their arthritis, bursitis, lumbago, tendonitis, and what not, while they chugged those Kentucky bourbons, followed by tall glasses of Pabst Blue Ribbon. And, of course, grandma had her tales to tell and how a few glasses of vodka were her perfect remedy. Eventually, one of them would put on an old record and they would be singing in English or Slovak, depending on the music, and the mood would change.

Looking back, it is almost hard to believe that at age 19 I climbed to the top of Mt. Fuji in Japan when I was stationed there. I went with about 25 other sailors on a tour bus to the foot of the mountain where we disembarked for further transportation to the 5th station where the actual climb began. Leading the pack was Capt. Jameson, commanding officer of our ship, the USS Ajax. He was adept at such activities, having climbed the Alps in Austria, Switzerland and Northern Italy.

We had our "Fuji Sticks" with us, those poles we were given which needed to be stamped at each station along the way to the top. It was cold at the top of that volcano, but we could rest for a couple of hours. Then, in order to see the sun rise, we had to get up when it was still dark and begin the descent over several feet of volcanic ash. I could see the advantage of the Fuji Stick now to keep from tumbling down over the ash, I was somewhere in the middle of the group when I watched in dismay as ironically, our dental officer took a tumble, broke a couple of teeth and had to be rushed to a hospital near the foot of the mountain. I have since climbed many mountains in Japan--and Korea, too, when I was teaching English there.

As the years passed and I found my left knee often giving out on me, I began to see how difficult it can be to climb stairs, and even to step off the curb going to and from my car. It is interesting to see how people react to one who is handicapped. Some folks are super nice, and even open doors for you or help you carry packages. Other folks tend to ignore you, and even run in front of you, to get ahead of you in line, or to enter church. I think of it as a kind of payback for when I was young and did the same.

It is incredible how insensitive some people can be when it comes to encountering someone who is handicapped. And little kids, although they may be excused, can be the worst. I remember an incident a few years back when one of our Knights, dressed in full plumage as color guard, was attending a special ceremony. After the ceremony his wife was beside him walking down the aisle when a toddler came running down the aisle and ran right into her, causing her to lose her balance, She tripped and landed on her face, breaking her nose, and had to be rushed to the hospital.

Dear Brother Knight,

It is with particular joy that I write to share with you the news that, at Noon today in Rome, the Vatican announced the formal recognition of a miracle attributed to our founder, Venerable Father Michael McGivney.

With this announcement, a Mass of Beatification will soon be scheduled.

This joyful news is the culmination of many years of determined effort, and I ask for your continued and increased prayers as we prepare for the day when our founder will be known as "Blessed Michael McGivney."

The Vatican announcement can be found below:

Decrees of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints


On May 26, 2020, the Holy Father Francis received in audience His Eminence Cardinal Angelo Becciu, prefect of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints. During the audience, the Supreme Pontiff authorized the same Congregation to promulgate the Decrees regarding:

[...] the miracle, attributed to the intercession of the Venerable Servant of God Michael McGivney, Diocesan Priest, Founder of the Order of the Knights of Columbus; born on August 12, 1852 in Waterbury (United States of America) and died in Thomaston (United States of America) on August 14, 1890; Venerable Michael McGivney was the founder of the Knights of Columbus, now the world's largest Catholic fraternal organization. After studies in Canada and the United States, he was ordained to the priesthood by Archbishop James Gibbons in Baltimore. He founded the Knights of Columbus as a mutual aid society, geared especially to working men and their families. He was known for his tireless work among his parishioners. He died at the early age of 38 from pneumonia.

I would ask each brother Knight to learn more about our founder at the newly updated Father McGivney Guild website where the Order will also regularly post news and updates related to the beatification.

And if you would like to learn even more about our founder's heroic life and continuing legacy, please consider reading Father McGivney's biography, Parish Priest, and the newly-released book *The Knights of Columbus: An Illustrated History*.
