Dear Knights,  
 On May 2<sup>nd</sup>, we had our very first International Dinner and Cultural Entertainment thanks to the World Youth Day 2016 pilgrims, who used the event as a fundraiser. This event celebrated the catholicity or universality of our faith, since you can find it in all of the remotest location of our planet. We also learned about the apparitions of The Lady of All Nations, since those approved apparitions tie in so well with the theme of the evening. Our Lady appeared 56 times to a woman named Ida Peerdeman in Amsterdam, Holland from 1945 until 1959. The first of the apparitions occurred on March 25<sup>th</sup>, 1945. You realize the significance of March 25<sup>th</sup>, no? What great feast occurs on that date? It is the Annunciation, when the Angel Gabriel appears to our Blessed Mother, calling her by her title, "Full of Grace," and announcing that she will conceive under

the power of the Holy Spirit the Son of God. Over the course of those apparitions, our Blessed Mother appears to have predicted the second Vatican Council, which came as a big surprise to many when it was announced in 1963. She also affirmed that modernization was necessary, so that the Church could take advantage in modern technology in order to better evangelize the world. She also warned of grave danger in the last part of the 20<sup>th</sup> Century of a resurgence of a modernist heresy. These apparitions were deemed to be of supernatural origin in 2002 after almost 50 years of investigation. She also says that she will be referred to as "The Lady" and many of her messages were about things that were happening around the world. That is why this apparition is called, "The Lady of All Nations." One of the tasks of every Knight, remember the degree exemplification that you have taken, is to ensure that our homes and families are

protected from the evils of sin and moral degeneration. Our words and example and the intercession of Our Lady can make a difference. Over the course of those apparitions, Mary asked us to pray and in particular use the following prayer:  
 LORD JESUS CHRIST, SON OF THE FATHER, SEND NOW YOUR SPIRIT OVER THE EARTH. LET THE HOLY SPIRIT LIVE IN THE HEARTS OF ALL NATIONS, THAT THEY MAY BE PRESERVED FROM DEGENERATION, DISASTER AND WAR. MAY THE LADY OF ALL NATIONS, WHO ONCE WAS MARY, BE OUR ADVOCATE. AMEN.

## MESSAGE FROM THE FIELD AGENT

My dear Brother Knights,  
You know the old saying, “the grass seems greener on the other side of the fence,” but we all know that it rarely is. The same holds true when it comes to replacing your existing Knights of Columbus life insurance with coverage offered by another company. Perceptions are deceiving. A move to the “greener” grass on the other side of the fence might seem like a good one, but it can leave you with less *green* in your wallet — in some cases, a lot less. That’s why it pays to remember another old adage, “Read the fine print.”



There are many reasons to keep your existing coverage in force, whether that coverage is with the Knights of Columbus or with another company.

I’ll focus on the potential pitfalls of replacing coverage here — pitfalls that an agent trying to convince you that the grass actually is greener might neglect to mention.



First, all life insurance contracts contain a *contestability period*, which allows the insurer to contest claims made for a period — typically two years — after the contract is issued. Chances are, this is no longer an issue with your current coverage. Second, it’s unlikely that you can obtain the same amount of coverage, for the same premium, that you were able to obtain with your existing contract. The two factors that determine how much you’ll need to pay for life insurance coverage are age and health.

Certainly, you’re older now than you were when you took out your current coverage. There’s no way around that. And you have to ask yourself, has your health changed during that time? Is your blood pressure the same? Your cholesterol? Have you gained weight? All these factors can affect the amount of coverage you’ll get for your premium dollar.

If someone encourages you to replace — or worse, drop — your existing coverage with the Knights of Columbus, please call me. I’ll show you how your existing coverage is working for you and why replacement is rarely in your best interest.
