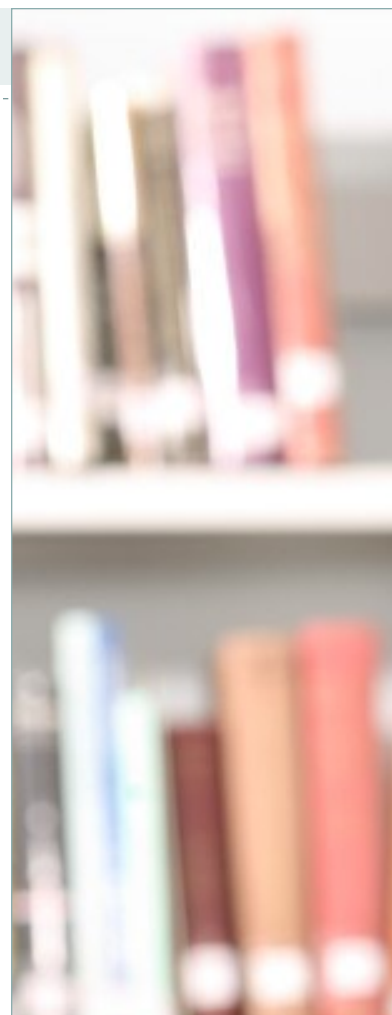

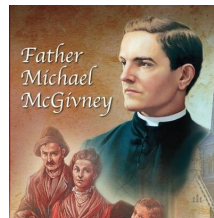
(As I am sure we all know, our Adoration Chapel is closed until further notice. But as soon as it is opened again we will continue our schedule as always)

CHAPLAIN'S AUGUST MESSAGE

Brothers,

August was supposed to bring the start of a new school year, with modifications of course, with masks, block schedules, and some distant learning for our children and grandchildren.



Now, it appears that all will be back to distant learning. Just like we are back to distant masses or parking lot masses, priests giving us communion with masks, and people waiting outside the hall to get into confessions. Why doesn't it just go back to normal? Why don't the priests and the bishops just stand up and give us what we need, exactly what we had before the pandemic? Why are they caving in to the pressure from the non-practicing elected official? Why? Why? Why?



Just like many of you, I have found myself getting caught up

with those type of questions, especially when I am connected to social media and reading how others are posing the same questions. And those anonymous people who are posting them are at times criticizing our bishops and priests for the difficult decisions that they have to make regarding the delicate balance between ma-

king the sacraments available and keep all safe. I know that I give thanks to God with each and every modification or update that someone else is the one that He has put in place to make the difficult decision and not me. Whatever decision is made in these difficult times, there will be many of us who are not happy, who complain, or who point fingers.

But really, what happens to us when we get caught up in asking the questions, complaining, and/or pointing? Does it truly make us feel any better? Or does it just make us more stressed? When COVID-19 first began, I was reading each and every morning all of the headlines and data compiled by the CDC and John Hopkins University. I was looking at the online map intently and watching the bubbles that showed the counts for each city and county grow and grow and grow. I found myself more and more agitated each and every day. And then, with Shelter in Place beginning on March 19, I would spend hours and hours at my kitchen table working, reading the latest headlines, and not moving. I was averaging less than 1,000 steps a day. It wasn't good for me physically, mentally, or spiritually. Finally, I decided to STOP!



I realized that I was getting so caught up in all of those concerns

that I was forgetting the important things. I wasn't putting God first. I definitely wasn't putting my family second. All of the worldly concerns were keeping me from being focused.

Then, I went outside.

I sat in my backyard in the cool morning.

I watched the birds fly by.

I felt the cool breeze on my face.

I listened as the wind rustled the leaves on the tree.

All of God's creation gave me peace, a sense of calm, and a reminder that He is in charge. Sitting at my kitchen table and looking at the screen of my laptop was not giving a sense of joy, to the contrary. Sitting out in nature was. And that sense helped remind me how many times God tells us in Sacred Scripture to not worry, to be patient, to let Him be in charge. There are scripture experts who say that there are close to 365 citations in the Bible where God says, in one form or another, "Don't worry, I got this." 365 times because we forget and need to be reminded daily. We tend to get caught up in the concerns of the world. We stress and worry about why things aren't fixed NOW.

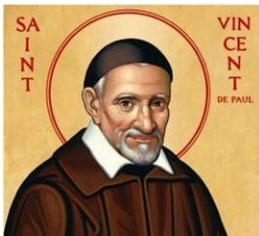
