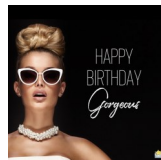

DEACON'S SEPTEMBER MESSAGE

Brothers,

Last month, I posed a series of questions about the mass. The answers should have been easy to respond since we supposedly go to mass at least on every Sunday. After reviewing all of the brothers who were brave enough to respond, two of the respondents stood out. They did not get all 16 of the questions right, even with one of the questions inadvertently repeated, but they did get more right than the others. I have a prize for each of them, Brother Dave



Sichak, and our Deputy Grand Knight, Taide Zamora.

If you were not brave enough to reply, I recommend that you stop reading right here and go back and read the questions. See how many you know the answer to and send me an email. I am not going to give all of the 16 answers here. Just a few of them

When does the mass officially begin?



Many assumed that the mass begins when the priests says, "In the name of the Father and of the Holy Spirit" or perhaps when he (and the deacon) kiss the altar. Those are good guesses, but both are incorrect. For some of us who are serving at the mass, the mass begins a while before the scheduled start time. I arrive 30 minutes before the scheduled start time, because I need to vest, to move my microphone and binder, to make sure that I know of any final changes or instructions, to make sure that the altar servers know what to expect, and to pray. But those 30 minutes before are not the official beginning of the mass, as they pertain to me and maybe a few other "liturgical stewards," as they are referred to now.

So, when does the mass official begin? Officially, the mass begins with the very first note of the entrance hymn. The hymn will be announced, the signal for all to stand, but the official beginning is at that note. "Why with the music?" you might ask. The mass itself is a experience

in community. Liturgy actually comes from two words in Greek, leitōs urgo, which mean public works. It is not "me and Jesus" at the mass, it is all of us together. And, there is nothing that unites us more as one than music. Even if we do no more than "make a joyful noise," we are singing together the same words, more or less the same notes, and even breathing at the same time. How much more united can we be than that? Like everything else to do with the mass, the Church is very intentional about how the mass begins.

Just as an FYI: if you are at a daily mass, and the priest decides that he does not want to sing, and there is no one else singing, there should still be the "Entrance Antiphon," which would take the place of the opening hymn (officially, it is the other way around - the opening hymn takes the place of the antiphon, but that is splitting hairs). Once that antiphon is announced, then the mass would have officially begun.

The next question that I posed had to do with when the mass is over. I am going to save the answer to that question until later, since the third question also has to do with the beginning of the mass. "Where does the mass begin and why does it begin there?" I would think that it is easy to figure out the answer to that now that you know when the mass officially begins. If the mass begins with the opening hymn, where is the priest, deacon, and servers at that point. We are all at the back of the church by the glass doors. That is where the mass begins, not at the altar, not in the sacristy, not at the presider's chair.

All of the big liturgies begin at the same place, at the entrance to the church -- baptisms (if done correctly), weddings, funerals, masses of all sorts. They begin there at the door, as that is the entry place from the world into the sacred space which is the nave of the church. Those doors are our first steps towards heaven, represented by the tabernacle, which contains the closest that we can get to heaven before actually dying, since Jesus is contained within. Those doors separate the noise, problems, and hectic life and the nave of the church where we will receive Jesus if we are properly disposed. We should act differently once we pass through those doors, as they are leading us to

heaven.

That is one of the things that is most noticeable about people who are not from St. Joseph's. Many who are not from St. Joseph's walk in and keep talking, sometimes loudly. They walk around as if they are at a ball game or at the beach instead of within the walls of a sacred space. At St. Joseph's, and there are exceptions, almost all seem to realize that inside the nave of the church is different. It is, for the most part, quieter, more solemn, and it should be. Once we have passed through the doors, we are that much closer to heaven. We really should act like it.

So, the mass begins at the entrance to the church at the moment where we are moving from the outside world towards heaven and at the first notes of the opening hymn, which unite us in song and in breath.



Next month, I will continue answering the 16 questions that I posed in August. If you still want to try and respond to the other 14 which I have not answered yet, I might be able to swing a smaller prize to those that have the correct answers.
