CHAPLAIN'S JUNE MESSAGE

For a healthy Christian life,
we need spiritual exercise.

Brothers,
Where are we spiritually? I pose that question

knowing that the majority of men who read it will most likely not even bother to continue. We tend to want to shy away from anything and everything that has to do with our faith or anything "spiritual." As a Deacon, I know that. I know that as a man as well. I did the same for many years. Luckily, something happened to change that in me when I began to realize that I had this longing or ache that the things of the world just couldn't fill. I watched sports and television in general, I played games (board, sports, and video), I hung out with others. There was something always missing, however. I would be happy for a while, but never seemed to have the "JOY" that Father Sam keeps talking about. I had no idea how to find it.



I can't put my finger on the moment that I began to realize, kind of like St. Augustine so

many years ago, that what was lacking in me was God. St. Augustine put it like this, "Our souls are restless until they rest in you, Lord." I have found over the years that is true. When I get myself and my pride out of the way of attempting to control things they seem to work out, I have less frustration, and I have more joy. I would hope by now that you have all seen my mask, unless you live far away and aren't able to see me in person. It says, "I have a smile under this mask." The image that you see here with this paragraph is the one that I usually have on for Zoom meetings. The mask shares how I feel the majority of the time (even when things aren't going well or stress is high). The picture shows how I feel the majority of the time (even when I am working long hours or struggling with something else). Why? I'm confident that it is because I have worked through things spiritually to realize that I am not in control, these things I am stressing about don't really matter in the big picture, and all is going to work out for the best in the end re-

gardless of what I think or do. And I have only come to realize all of that because I have worked on my spiritual life, have done spiritual exercise, have grown in my faith. Without all of that I would be lost.

So, I pose the question again that I posed at the beginning. By this



point, those of you that are still reading have at least worked a little on your spiritual life. I mean we promised when we became Knights of Columbus that we would be PRACTICING Catholics and would pray the rosary as often as possible, right? Are we doing that? Are we doing other things to strengthen our faith? Are we reading spiritual books (the Bible, books on the lives of the saints, or other books). If we are like many and we don't read as often as we should (and we all do have time to read even if we choose not to), are we watching videos or listening to podcast that are helping us with our faith? Fr. Mike Spitz' videos or his podcast The Bible in a Year have gotten an awful lot of people excited about listening to the Bible being read and explain by an engaging and enthusiast priest. Are we going on spiritual retreats or conferences. COVID-19 has made that more difficult over the course of the past year, but I have found how much more rewarding a retreat is than just going to some tourist trap for an extended weekend.



There are great hermits that are able to go out into the desert and work on their spiritual lives

by themselves. The vast majority of us cannot do it alone, however. I've found that having a good group of men around me, reminding me of what is right and calling me out when I am not doing it helps. In a wonderful program for men to

grow deeper in the faith called Exodus90, we have what we call anchor. It refers to mountain climbers, who need someone to stable them as they climb. That way if they fall, they have someone to help them out. My anchor is a brother Knight, a former Grand Knight. I call him my anchorman. I send him texts of photos of Will Ferrell from his silly movie, Anchorman. It is by thinking of my anchor that I continue to get up 30 minutes earlier to do what I need to do every morning, even when the "getting up" is not easy.

So, brother, do you have an anchor? Do you have an accountability buddy who will help you when you are getting lazy or doing something you shouldn't? I know that for most of us, our wives would love that role but that doesn't work. It comes across like nagging, and we tend to become defensive and/or ignore. Right? We need a good, faithful male friend, who isn't afraid to push and encourage us to do the right thing. If you do have one yet, why not? Do you want to get to heaven? Are you afraid to do what it takes to get there? I know that we are comfortable in what we are doing, but God is really calling us to more. An accountability buddy is what being a BROTHER Knight should be. Or is that not what a brother should be doing?
