

ADVOCATE'S ADVICE

In my last article I recommended that everyone should read the Diary of St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, *Divine Mercy in my Soul*, and to pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy. EWTN prays the Chaplet at 12:00 noon every day, since they are on Eastern Standard Time, noon for us is 3:00 PM for them. I also discovered that we can pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet every Friday at 3:00 PM at St. Joseph's (our parish bell ring out at 3 PM to announce it). The significance of 3:00 PM is due to the revelation to St. Faustina (Diary 1572) that 3:00 PM is "The Hour of Mercy." Jesus said to her, "As often as you hear the clock strike the 3rd hour, immerse yourself in My Mercy." That is the hour that Christ died on the cross for our salvation. (That is why our parish bells sounds at 3 PM). The Diary is a record of St. Faustina's personal relationship with Jesus Christ and has many revelations from Jesus and Mary. The following excerpt is from section 96. It has great significance to me and since it was near the beginning of the book, it managed to keep me reading the book until I was done. I hope that it will be significant for you too. St. Faustina is talking about the trials of the soul and temptation of Satan. "The soul's love for God is still not such as God would have it. The soul suddenly loses the tangible perception of God's presence. Various defects and imperfections rise up within it and must fight them furiously. All her faults lift up their heads, and the soul's vigilance is great. The former awareness of the presence of God gives place to coldness and spiritual dryness; the soul has no taste for spiritual exercises; it cannot pray, either in the old way, or in the manner in which it had begun to pray. It struggles this way and that but can find no satisfaction. God has hidden himself from it; and it can find no consolation in creatures, nor can any of these creatures find a way of consoling it. The soul craves passionately for God, but sees it's own misery; it begins to sense God's justice; it seems to it that it has lost all the gifts God has given it; it's mind is dimmed, and darkness fills it; unspeakable torment begins. The soul tries to explain its fate to the confessor, but it is not understood and is assailed by even greater unrest. Satan begins his work."

RECORDER'S RAMBLINGS

Brother Knights, I want to share this month some thoughts from Deacon Harold Burke-Sivers, who is a renown deacon from Portland. If you have never heard him speak either on EWTN or on Catholic Answers, you have missed out. Recently, he posted in a blog some ideas about our society's view of "freedom."

Deacon Harold was reflecting on why he had not allowed his 13-year-old daughter the "freedom" to view *Glee* on television. I cut and pasted part of his reasoning below:

"What, then, does it mean to be *truly, authentically* free? If you think about it, there are only two answers: personal freedom, i.e., the freedom to do what I want, or God's freedom, i.e., living, acting, and 'being' in a way commensurate with His truth. Moral Relativism (aka: Secular Orthodoxy)—the magisterium of modern society—posits a 'freedom' from objective truth, and professes political correctness and values-neutral education as foundational principles that promote the very ideas which, left unchallenged, will ultimately erode the spiritual foundation upon which our faith is built all in the name of 'tolerance' and 'diversity,' and at the expense of authentic truth and freedom. Our culture, through shows like *Glee*, tells us that freedom means 'independence'; that I don't need to subject myself to principles that are true in themselves but that truth can be changed depending upon current trends or my particular situation. The truth of God's ever abundant and merciful love is rooted in freedom—a freedom *from* and a freedom *for*: the freedom from sin so that we can be free for God.

"At first glance, living according to God's truth seems burdensome—following commandments and living according to a moral code goes against society's view and understanding of freedom.

"Let me illustrate the two types of freedom. Imagine a violin, representing the Body of Christ, that has four strings, each representing a member of the Body. Now picture one of the strings removed from the violin and laying on a table. Our culture would tell us that the string on the table is free: it is no longer subject to the violin and can now do whatever it wants. It is no longer bound by the restraints (i.e., the moral codes and commandments) of the violin and can now 'be itself.'

"From the Church's perspective, the violin string is not truly free because its full potential is not being actualized; by not freely choosing to be part of the whole, by allowing itself to be freed from that which makes it truly unique—from that which is true, good, and beautiful—the string can never fully be what it was created to be. The Church teaches that by freely submitting ourselves to God's law—to God's loving care, protection, and divine providence—by making a complete gift of ourselves to the Giver of all gifts, then can we truly and fully be the person who God created us to be. It is only when the string is tethered to the body of the violin, when it is tuned to the unique and proper pitch that it was designed for, when it is played in harmony with the other strings, that the full potential of not only the string but the entire instrument is truly realized and fully appreciated."

LECTURER'S NOTES

GOD, YOU ARE REALLY OUT THERE!

Amen, amen, I say to you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who came [before me] are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters through me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. A thief comes only to steal and slaughter and destroy; I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly.—John 10:1-10

In this passage Jesus says that He is the gate, twice. More on the gate below. Last month I wrote about the God the Father and touched on some of His attributes, but there are other things about God that I didn't address. First among them are His infinite dignity and our relationship to that dignity. For our part, that relationship is expressed in our form of worship. We the created turn toward the creator and acknowledge that we belong to Him. He created us in His image and likeness so our fulfillment is with Him; apart from Him we are incomplete. The world is full of incomplete people, we see them everywhere go and they fill the news. They are liars, gossips, greedy, thieves and prideful people who don't live up to their God given dignity. Our Christian call is to find our fulfillment in God and take that fulfillment out to those who are incomplete. Can you imagine how much crime and confusion in the world would disappear if people would return to God in obedience. Obedience is usually the hang-up and our culture teaches us to submit to no man not even God himself; most people are obedient to the culture.


In heaven, in the presence of God sin cannot exist. Sin is anything that separates us or brings division into our relationship with God. So to be worthy to enter into God's presence we must be separated from sin and those desires to sin. Another way to state that is that we must be united to God's holy will and at his service. Sure, that sounds easy but in truth it's not for most of the world. In the next passage Jesus again uses the analogy of the gate to illustrate the difficulty and necessity of searching out God's perfect will. The surprise isn't that there are false gates but that we actually have to discern the correct gate. We have a stake in the outcome.

Enter through the narrow gate; for the gate is wide and the road broad

that leads to destruction and those who enter through it are many. How narrow the gate and constricted the road that leads to life. And those who find it are few. "Beware of false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing, but underneath are ravenous wolves. By their fruits you will know them. Do people pick grapes from thorn bushes, or figs from thistles? Just so, every good tree bears good fruit, and a rotten tree bears bad fruit. A good tree cannot bear bad fruit, nor can a rotten tree bear good fruit. Every tree that does not bear good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire. So by their fruits you will know them. —Matt 7:13-20

As Catholics we have an edge in that department. It takes self discipline, the type we build up through fasting at Lent. It also takes obedience and humility which we should work at during lent as well as year around. It takes the sacraments, get to confession. It takes prayer and worship and it isn't ever easy but it is possible. Jesus tells us so.
