Here is a short history on St Faustina. I plan to share excerpts from her book in the next few months. Sister Faustina was a young, uneducated, nun in a convent of the Congregation of Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in Kraków, Poland during the 1930's. She came from a very poor family that struggled on their little farm during the years of World War I. She had only three years of very simple education, so hers were the humblest tasks in the convent, usually in the kitchen or garden. However, she received extraordinary revelations or messages from Our Lord Jesus. Jesus asked Sr. Faustina to record these experiences, which she compiled in notebooks. These notebooks are known today as the *Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska*, and the words contained within are God's loving message of Divine Mercy. Though the Divine Mercy message is not new to the teachings of the Church, Sr. Faustina's *Diary* sparked a great movement and a strong and significant focus on the mercy of Christ. Pope John Paul II canonized Sr. Faustina in 2000 making her the "first saint of the new millennium." Speaking of Sr. Faustina and the importance of the message contained in her *Diary*, the Pope call her "the great apostle of Divine Mercy in our time."

## LECTURER'S NOTES

### GOD, ARE YOU REALLY OUT THERE?

“We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is seen and unseen.” – Nicene Creed, 381 AD

At Mass we profess our faith with the Nicene Creed which begins with the line above. One short sentence states very quickly and clearly five basic tenets of our faith.

1) We believe. 2) God is one. 3) God is Father. 4) God is Almighty. 5) God is creator of everything that exists. The End. Well, not really. This is more like the beginning. I was privileged recently to teach a class called “The Existence of God” which I have sat in on many times, but don't recall ever teaching. I have to say that the more I thought about teaching that topic, the more nervous I became. God is a difficult topic to approach; because God is impossible to understand with the human mind, and among human minds mine is pretty average. Facing a challenge like that requires a bit of meditation, a bible and a catechism. I couldn't do it otherwise. The great thing is that in this one sentence all of Christendom, Judaism and Islam can find agreement and this is a great place to begin a discussion. At the same time, this sentence doesn't begin to touch the mysteries that encompass God the Father.

Consider some of His attributes; God is one, there is no division within the Godhead, but Muslims and Jews disagree with this Christian truth. God has revealed to His people that He is three individual persons who cannot be separated from one another. As Father, he is creator, law-giver and protector of His people. He is uncreated; He has no beginning. He is the first cause of all creation and has no creator. There is no God equal to or greater than our God. He is Almighty; He has and is the source of unlimited power. He is eternal and will have no end. He is unchanging and is as He always has been, which is the one constant in the entire universe. He is truth, goodness, beauty and love. So He doesn't just portray or project truth or goodness, He IS truth and goodness. We give love, we seek love and we receive love but that's just about the best we can do. God is the source of all love because He is love.

In discussions I have had with non-Catholic Christians, I have gathered that they aren't taught and don't understand that as creator, God isn't subject to the laws of His own creation. Let's use time, as an example. Because God created time, He isn't subject to it or its effects. He doesn't grow old and He can see us and our unborn great, great grand- children with the same clarity as Christopher Columbus or Julius Caesar. That may be a small point, but it prevents them from understanding Catholic practices like having Masses said for the dead or any

prayer to or for the deceased. For my Protestant friends, once a person is dead they are forgotten and they have no further knowledge of those on earth. As Catholics, we can ask God to be merciful to someone who died 10 years ago or we can ask a deceased family member or saint to intercede on our behalf.

When mankind wants to solve a problem, we throw money at research until we develop a new drug or invent a better mousetrap; and we admire our prowess. Not so in the pursuit of God. We don't search and find God; God reveals Himself to us. God's revelation is gradual and very subtle. It's usually in ways that you really have to discern, “Is this what I think it is?” For example, our God is a God of great order and organization.
