## CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Dear Brother Knights,  
April 7th is the  
Feast of St. Saint  
John Baptiste de  
la Salle,



who, over 200  
years ago, wrote  
a famous work  
called "*Twelve  
Virtues of a Good  
Teacher*" as a guide for the  
members of their religious  
order, the "Christian  
Brothers" (of winery fame!). He  
said there were twelve virtues  
that were essential for a  
teacher, but they also could be  
applied to the lives of the  
Knights of Columbus for their  
roles as teachers within their  
families. The Twelve Virtues  
are: *Seriousness (gravity),  
silence, humility, prudence,  
wisdom, patience, reserve,  
gentleness, zeal, vigilance,  
piety, and generosity.*

The sixth virtue, *patience*, is  
particularly important. St.  
John Baptiste de la Salle says  
that "*Patience is a virtue which  
makes us overcome, without  
murmuring and with submission  
to the will of God, all the evils of  
this life, and especially the  
cares inseparable from the  
education of youth.*" A teacher  
needs this virtue because "... he  
is nearly always with his

*students... This virtue consists,  
in his case, in supporting the  
disagreeable and unpleasant  
occurrences which may be met  
with in his employment."*

(Incidentally this is the same  
reason why parents need  
patience in the summertime,  
when they are "*nearly always  
with*" their children!) *A teacher  
is patient when he does not "take  
to heart the students' whims,  
jokes, and bad manners, or those  
of their parents; he learns to feel  
sorry for the limited powers of  
reason displayed by the  
students, due to their age, their  
light-headedness, and their  
inexperience.*

This antiquated text has some  
very wise things to say about  
complaining. Patience "*consists  
in accepting without complaint,  
all the ills that befall us.*" First  
of all we should not complain  
because it an affront to God to  
whom we should be always  
grateful and in whom we should  
always trust: "*murmuring about  
what happens is to outrage  
Providence.*" St. John quotes  
another great saint, Saint  
Francis de Sales, who  
said: "*Complain about them as  
little as possible; for it is certain  
that as a rule whoever  
complains, sins.*" Self-love  
always makes us feel such

injuries as greater than they  
really are. Above all, do not  
address your complaints to  
persons quick to grow indignant  
and to speak ill of others.  
Interestingly, St. Francis de Sales  
provides an alternative to  
gossiping. He says that if you  
must complain in order to "get it  
off your chest," it might be OK,  
provided that we unburden  
ourselves to a saintly person: "*If it  
is expedient for you to complain to  
someone, to remedy the offense, or  
even to soothe your own mind, let  
it be to someone with a calm  
disposition, who loves God; for  
otherwise, instead of relieving  
your heart, you would provoke it to  
even deeper disquiet; instead of  
removing the thorn which hurts  
you, you would be driving it in  
deeper.*"

God bless all of you, my fellow  
Knights, as you patiently bear  
with the task of teaching in  
various ways your wives, children,  
grandchildren, relatives and all  
those with whom you come into  
contact!

My dear Brother Knights,  
 This is an update on our membership status as of 3/01/13. We have a total 307 members of those 100 are insured, and 207 are associates. We have 6 inactive, 2 honorary, 18 honorary life, and 3 disabled. Our membership quota from Supreme is 21 and we are at 23% of that goal. Our insurance quota is 7, we have 0%. Out of our 307 members, 57 are still 1st Degree Knights. Out of those 57, only 5 signed up to take their 2nd

and 3rd Degrees on the 16<sup>th</sup> of last month. At our March meeting, we had approximately 25 members present.

### Lecturer's Notes: The Lord's Prayer Part III

***"This is how you are to pray:***

***Our Father in heaven,***

- 1. hallowed be your name,***
- 2. your kingdom come, your will be done,***
- 3. on earth as in heaven.***
- 4. Give us today our daily bread;***
- 5. and forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors;***
- 6. and do not subject us to the final test,***
- 7. but deliver us from the evil one,***

***if you forgive others their transgressions, your heavenly Father will forgive you. But if you do not forgive others, neither will your Father forgive your transgressions."***

***Matt 6:5-15***



To recap: Jesus, the second person of the Godhead, gives us instruction on how to address Him and what to ask for. And this is a huge advantage as to how we should orient our prayer,

our worship and our lives. I mentioned in the last two articles that *"The Lord's Prayer"* is also known as *"The Perfect Prayer."* Why? Because this is the only time that Jesus said ***"This is how you are to pray."*** The prayer He gave is also an outline for how to pray. We put God first then think about ourselves.

Let's review petitions 4 thru 7 in the prayer:

- 4. Give us today our daily bread;***
- 5. and forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors;***
- 6. and do not subject us to the final test,***
- 7. but deliver us from the evil one,***

In the introduction and first 3 petitions, we focus on God and acknowledge that He is almighty and we are not. With the next four petitions, we acknowledge that we are not God and He is. That isn't at all meant to demean or belittle mankind, but to allow us to recognize, meditate, and act upon the separating effect of sin. Restated: Sin separates us from God so we must separate ourselves from sin before we can reunite with God. That is the whole enchilada.

How do we do that?

- 4. Give us today our daily bread;*** (Learn to rely on the providence of God).

- 5. forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors;*** (Live the Golden Rule).

- 6. do not subject us to the final test,*** (Live in God's will, draw close and seek His protection in difficult times).

- 7. but deliver us from the evil one.*** (Ask for and follow God's guidance in all things).

Sure, that all sounds easy, but can we really live like that?

Yes, we can and we must.

Jesus told us so.

The April business meeting is on Tuesday, April 2nd at 7:00pm. The Second Friday Memorial Mass for the deceased Knights of this Council is on Friday, April 12th at 5:45pm. The Respect Life Rosary resumes after the 5:45 mass; please go! Don't forget to make a good confession and get cleaned up spiritually. Pray that God give us the grace to seek Him in prayer. Pray for the men and women who serve in law enforcement and the military. Pray that politicians have a conversion of heart. Pray for strong families. Above all, pray that Holy Mother Church around the world can withstand the buffets of her enemies. Pray for our priests and for our new Holy Father Pope Francis.
