CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

My dear Brother Knights, At St. Joseph's, we did not want the Year of Faith to end without having something special for the coming year. So we have chosen the theme "Go Deeper" (Duc in Altum). This means that we now want to allow the faith to enter more deeply and convert our hearts and the hearts of those around us.

The topic of *conversion* is explained very well in a book by Ralph Martin called "Fulfillment of All Desire," which describes the conversion and the spiritual journey of the great experts on the spiritual life, the "Doctors of the Church." Each of these great saints described the steps or stages of spiritual growth. They each used different terms and different numeration, but there are similarities which we can discover and apply to our own lives.

The book begins with St. Teresa of Avila, who is my favorite because she didn't really begin to advance in prayer until she was in her 40's and 50's, which gives hope to us older folks! She describes seven "mansions" in the soul which we must enter through prayer and meditation. She reached the sixth mansion ("Spiritual Betrothal") at age 47. She reached the seventh mansion ("spiritual marriage") at age 57, ten years before she died

in 1582.

For many years Teresa was a mediocre nun because of carelessness about sin: "As for venial sins, I paid little attention; and that is what destroyed me." She said that "liberal and permissive" priests did not warn her: "What was venial sin they said was no sin at all, and what was serious mortal sin they said was venial." She did not advance because of "lack of amendment" and "from placing myself in the occasion of sin." "The whole trouble lay in not getting at the root of the occasions of sin and with my confessors, who were of little help."

How can we begin to advance in the spiritual life? Ralph Martin gives two more recommendations which are found in the writings of the Doctors of the Church: 1) avoid self-reliance and 2) be quick in responding to the graces of God.

SELF RELIANCE: St. Teresa said "This self-reliance was what destroyed me." She spent many years "spinning her wheels" in the spiritual life, because she relied on herself. She wrote: "I give you one counsel: that you don't think that through your own strength or efforts you can arrive, for reaching this stage is beyond your power." We must rely on the sacraments. We must entrust and consecrate ourselves to Our Lord

and Our Lady. We must choose the way of spiritual childhood, trusting only in the mercy and power of God.

SLOWNESS: The difference between us and the saints is that they didn't delay in responding to the inspirations of the Holy Spirit. When the Spirit whispers in your ear that you should help someone, you should act immediately or at least schedule it in! When the Spirit urges you to pray, you've got to strike while the iron is hot! When you are reading a spiritual book and you feel inspired, you should immediately close your eyes and meditate! St. Teresa wrote that we must not ignore these favors from the Lord: "A soul to whom God grants such favors has a pledge that He wants to give it a great deal; if not impeded through its own fault, it will advance very far."

There you have it, men. That should get you started on the road to sainthood!



My dear Brother Knights, This month I wanted to write about prayer and the importance that it has for our lives as men and leaders of our families. I had something already started and then I opened up an article and read a statement that truly touched me. You will receive the article about prayer later, but this month the topic is now being TRUE Catholics and what that really means. Steve Ray, a Catholic apologist, said in a recent article in Catholic Answers Magazine, "We are not, or should not be, Catholic Christians because it makes us feel good or just because it was the way we were raised. Ultimately, we are Catholics because the Faith is true! And if it is true, we should know why it is true and be able to explain it to ourselves and to others (especially to our children)." Does that quote make you think of yourself? Are you Catholic just because your parents raised you Catholic? I can recall many times hearing from my father and then, later, repeating to my sons, "Why do you have to do that? Because I said so! That's why!" I'm sure that many of you said and heard the same thing. But those statements are

not helpful when it comes to our faith. What good does that do us when we are confronted by non-Catholics who question one of the beliefs of our TRUE religion? Are we "worshipping Mary" or statues as many non-Catholics think? Is the Pope the "richest man in the world"? Was Mary "really" assumed into heaven? You might think that these are silly questions, and hopefully you know the right answers, but it is exactly questions like these that have had many start to question the faith of their parents and others turn away from it. Do you know someone whose children or grandchildren aren't practicing Catholics anymore? Could it be that their parents weren't able to give them answers to questions like that, so the doubts began.

The great thing about each of us is that we are part of a fabulous parish! Not only does our parish have a vibrant Knights Council with activities like the Adopt-a-Family Dinner on the 7th, but also it offers us many opportunities to learn more about our faith. We had multiple opportunities during the Year of Faith to attend the Catechism 101 classes. What a wealth of information about our beautiful faith! Now the bible studies during Advent and Lent are starting up again. And the parish missions that are offered to us are always great learning opportunities. If we take part in only some of things that the parish offers, there is a much lower chance of us being unprepared to "explain to ourselves and to others (especially our children)" why our faith is true. 5) Are donations to Knights of Columbus councils and assemblies deductible on the donor's income tax return?

No. Donations to Knights of Columbus councils, assemblies, and chapters for fraternal or social purposes are never deductible and most donations for charitable purposes are not deductible.

"Well that's simple" answered the old chap, "It was two million years old when I started working here 69 years ago."


Jack strode into *John's Stable* looking to buy a horse. "Listen

Lecturer's Notes: December: Advent

"The Spirit and the bride say, 'Come.' Let the hearer say, 'Come.' Let the one who thirsts come forward, and the one who wants it receive the gift of life-giving water. I warn everyone who hears the prophetic words in this book: if anyone adds to them, God will add to him the plagues described in this book, and if anyone takes away from the words in this prophetic book, God will take away his share in the tree of life and in the holy city described in this book. The one who gives this testimony says, 'Yes, I am coming soon.' Amen! Come, Lord Jesus! The grace of the Lord Jesus be with all.—Rev. 22: 17-21 This reading is taken from the book of Revelation. This book is attributed to John who was the last apostle to die. The canon of the Bible was officially closed when the last apostle died; and no other writings were considered "inspired." John is significant, because he was one of the original 12. He lived among Jesus, Mary his mother, and all of the other apostles and disciples; and he knew all of these people personally. Additionally, John saw Jesus change water to wine, cure lepers, and raise the dead among other spectacular miracles. John's words are credible; they are addressed to his contemporaries as well as us today. This passage

forms the very last four verses of the Bible. Of all the host of stories and miracles, genres and histories, this is the passage that God wants to leave you with. This is the taste He wants to leave on your tongue. In summary, John is saying, "Hurry back, Lord." God's reply is, "I'll be back soon." Jesus is a departing lover who promises to return to his beloved and right all wrongs. And He will. This is like the part of the movie where my wife reaches for the Kleenex, loves promise fulfilled. Again, our Catholic faith leads from the front when we celebrate Advent each vear. We spend the last four weeks of each year preparing with eager anticipation for the return of our Lord. The Church picks up right where the Bible leaves off and in doing so she takes us, the faithful, right into the story. Now I want the Kleenex. Advent is now upon us. Not only is this the season of the last four verses of the Bible, but it is the beginning of the liturgical year. HAPPY LITURGICAL NEW YEAR !!! Since Advent of 2012, the Church has proclaimed the Gospel of St. Luke; and from now until next December, we will hear the Gospel of St. Matthew. During this season of preparation for the coming of the Lord, we prepare to encounter him through our prayer life, in the Mass, at the end of our lives, and at the end of time. We have lots of opportunity to encounter Jesus and we must always be

prepared. He will hold us accountable. This is a great time to make a good confession. As a special treat for this Advent Season, members of this Council will be leading the Respect Life rosary on Friday, December 13th after the 5:45 PM Mass. Please, plan to attend as we raise our voice in unison to bring about the end of abortion. Also, the Advent Mission this year is December 8-12, and will be led by Fr. Wade Menezes, the topic: "Reality Check - The Four Last Things." Have a wonderful Advent and a very Merry Christmas! See you at Mass.
