# CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE

Brothers,  
I would assume that this will be the most anticipated year for most of us in a long time. The image to the right of this text was made long before December arrived, obviously, as December had even more quarantine and stress. We are all ready for life to go back to some semblance of normalcy. The vaccines will help, in spite of some concerns with them as well. If nothing else, we can all pray that 2021 should be better than 2020.

The important thing to remember thinking back to 2020 and going forward, is that in the end, God wins. Even in really positive and happy years, we still have struggles and "bad" things that happen. The key to our success and not being overwhelmed by the "bad" things is in how we react to them. Do we get upset and end up causing stress for others as we let known our own frustrations? Or do we buckle down and work on making the situation come out as best as possible?

There are multiple things beyond our control that we have to let go and not try to control. Why do we worry about those? Some of my own biggest frustration in my 55 years have been over things that I have no control and no say. I have had to learn with time and patience to let go and let God. And 99 times out of 100, once I have found a way to let go, things have worked themselves out.

One of the things that has worked well for me is to pray. I have found the Memorare to be especially helpful for me. I have found that when I pray it or a handful of other prayers, I refocus on controlling what I can (myself) and not worrying as much about the other details. My blood pressure drops, my frustration goes away, and I am able to be more productive in helping all to work through what ever is going on. Can I say that this technique of praying of Memorare always works? No. It works more time than not. Here are some questions to reflect on as

you think about what might work best for you.

1. Can you love like St. Teresa of Calcutta? (She was called Mother Teresa before she was canonized.)
2. Can you pray like St. Therese of Lisieux?
3. Can you bi-locate like St. Pio of Pietrelcina? (You might know him as Padre Pio.)
4. Can you elevate like St. Joseph of Cupertino?
5. Can you forgive like Immaculée Ilibagiza? (Look up her story of forgiving those that committed the genocide in Rwanda of the Tutsi people that she is part of.)

The answer to all of those questions is most likely no, at least not by yourself. But neither could they. They all needed God. God knows you better than you know yourself. He knows what you are capable of, while you only know what you have done in the past. Ask Him in prayer to help you to become

# DEPUTY GRAND KNIGHT'S MESSAGE

Happy New Year, Brother Knights!

As we look into 2021, we need to meditate and thank our Lord for allowing us to be well and learn from the year 2020. On January 6, 2021 we celebrate Three Kings Day. On this day, the baby Jesus receives three special gifts that only a spiritual king would receive.

The first gift was gold, which symbolizes kingship. The second one was frankincense, an incense, a symbol of deity. What is deity? Deity or God is not only a supernatural being but a supernatural being with powers greater than those of ordinary humans, but who interacts with humans positively in ways that carry humans to new levels of consciousness beyond the grounded preoccupations of ordinary life.

The third gift myrrh, an embalming oil, is a symbol of death. This is so amazing that all this was already predicted and the three kings knew what to bring Jesus. In other countries, such as Mexico, they do not give gifts on December 25 nor does "Santa" bring gifts. Instead, the children put their shoes against the wall at night and the three kings (parents) leave their gifts on top of their shoes. During Christmas week, they have Posadas, where they go house to house like Joseph and Mary, looking for shelter. Once they arrive at the house that gives them shelter, the party commences in honor of Our Lord Jesus.

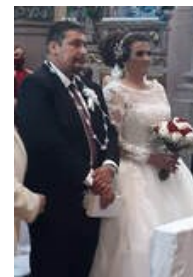
