

# FATHER MARK'S MESSAGE

Dear brother Knights, I want to thank the Knights of Columbus for doing the hard work of “manning” the Fireworks Booth in the Orchard Supply parking lot. With the extreme summer heat it seems that this would be a difficult and perhaps even dangerous task! But the Knights of Columbus always seem to be ready to make sacrifices and do what must be done! I very much appreciate this effort which will raise money for the new St. Joseph's Parish scouting programs “Trail Life Boys” and “American Heritage Girls”. I look forward to participating in the family-friendly outings of these new parish-based scouting programs.



This year I never tire of proclaiming that it is the 100th anniversary of the apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima. This month we can remember that when Mary

appeared on July 13<sup>th</sup>, 1917, she showed the three shepherd children a vision of hell. She asked the children to make sacrifices in order to save the souls of sinners. Immediately the children began to undertake bodily sacrifices. They gave away their lunches to their sheep or to the poor. They went without drinking on hot summer days. They would strike their ankles with prickly nettles. They found an old rope and cut it into three pieces which they wore around their waists close to their skin as penance. In the August apparition Mary told the children that God was pleased with their sacrifices but she told Jacinta to wear the rope only during the day since it was preventing her from being able to sleep at night. These children were truly convinced that it was urgent that they make these heroic sacrifices for the sake of the poor sinners. Perhaps our Knights will remember this when they must endure the heat and the discomfort of working in the fireworks booth!

As I have studied the apparitions of Fatima, I have discovered a very interesting detail. Once some people were speaking to Lucia about the apparitions and

a lady in the crowd accused Lucia of lying to them. She said: “You lied to us. You said that Mary did not tell us to pray for sinners.” After a moment of thought Lucia responded that she did not lie. She reaffirmed what she had said: “Mary did not tell us to pray for sinners. She told us to pray for peace. And she told us to MAKE SACRIFICES for sinners.”

This is very interesting. Mary told the children several times to “continue to recite the Rosary every day to obtain peace in the world and the end of the war.” She told them to “make sacrifices for sinners.”

This detail makes me think of a true story that I heard on EWTN Catholic Radio. A man said that he was frustrated because he was constantly nagging his daughter to dress more modestly, but she never listened. Then he decided that he would stop nagging and that instead he would secretly do some fasting for her. He renounced certain foods and skipped some meals. A few months later he was amazed when she came up to him of her own accord and said: “You know, Dad, I have been thinking about what you said and you're right. I'm going to start dressing

more modestly.” This story confirms that although prayer is important, it is perhaps bodily penance that really helps to convert sinners. Prayer is sometimes easier for us than doing physical penance. Perhaps we have grown soft in our modern age and we need to understand the secret of the cross and of suffering which Jesus himself used to save sinners. Recall that the devil told God that Job would not be able to endure physical suffering: “Skin for skin! All that a man has he will give for his life. But put forth your hand and touch his bone and his flesh. Then surely he will curse you to your face.” When suffering touches our very flesh, it really hits home and has a great impact on us. It makes us more effective like Christ Crucified who saved sinners by his suffering.

Here is the description by Lucia herself of what happened during the apparition of July 13, 1917: “A few moments after arriving at the Cova da Iria, near the Holm oak, where a large number of people were praying the Rosary, we saw the flash of light once more, and a moment later Our Lady appeared on the Holm oak. Mary said: “I want you to come back here on the thirteenth of next month. Continue to say the Rosary every day in honor of Our Lady of the Rosary, to obtain the peace of the world and the end of the war, because only she can obtain it.... **Make sacrifices for sinners, and say often, especially while making a sacrifice: O Jesus, this is for love of Thee, for the conversion of sinners, and in reparation for offences committed against the Immaculate Heart of Mary.**”

As Our Lady spoke these

words she opened her hands once more, as had during the two previous months. The rays of light seemed to penetrate the earth, and we saw as it were a sea of fire. Plunged in this fire were demons and souls in human form, like transparent burning embers, all blackened or burnished bronze, floating about in the conflagration, now raised into the air by the flames that issued from within themselves together with great clouds of smoke, now following back on every side like sparks in huge fires, without weight or equilibrium, amid shrieks and groans of pain and despair, which horrified us and made us tremble with fear. (it must have been this sight which caused me to cry out, as people say they heard me do). The demons could be distinguished by their terrifying and repellent likeness to frightful and unknown animals, black and transparent like burning coals. terrified and as if to plead for succor, we looked up at Our Lady, who said to us, so kindly and so sadly: **“You have seen hell, where the souls of poor sinners go. It is to save them that God wants to establish in the world devotion to my Immaculate Heart. If you do what I tell you, many souls will be saved, and there will be peace.** If my requests are granted, Russia will be converted and there will be peace. If not, she will scatter her errors throughout the world, provoking wars and persecution of the Church. The good will be martyred, the Holy Father will have much to suffer, and various nations will be destroyed...But in the end, my Immaculate Heart will triumph. The Holy Father will consecrate Russia to me, Rus-

sia will be converted, and a certain period of peace will be granted to the world”.

“Do you want to learn a prayer?” the vision asked, “Yes we do!” the children responded.

“When you recite the Rosary, say at the end of each decade: Oh My Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell, and lead all souls to Heaven, especially those in most need of Your Mercy.”
