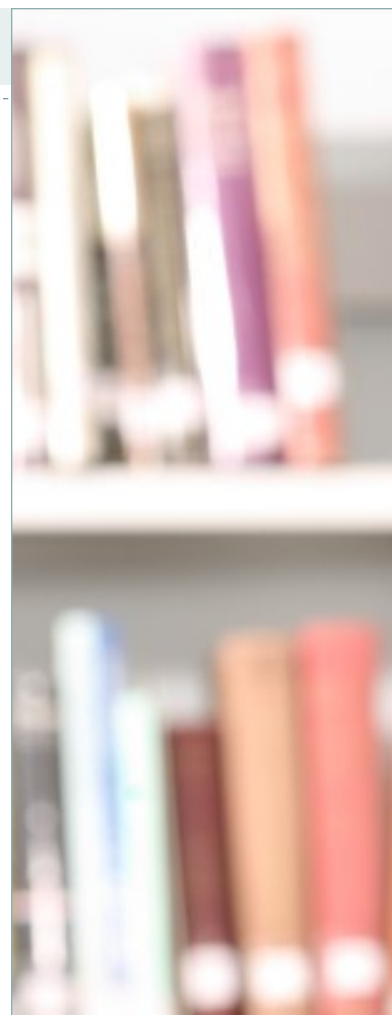

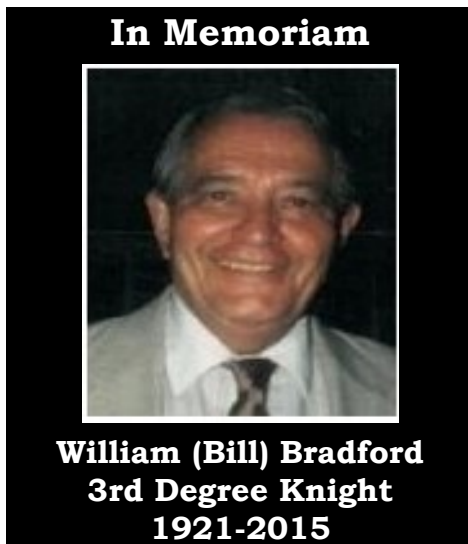
# FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT

During our Retention Committee's efforts this past year, they discovered that one of our Brothers had passed away a few years ago and we did not know about it. Brother Bradford had moved to the Yountville Veterans Home and passed away in 2015.



Technology – it is in our lives everywhere and growing. Remember the dial phone? The phone prefixes that began with letters? When you had to change the channel on your TV with the dial? When color TV was “new”? I marvel at what I have seen in my lifetime.

I admit to being a bit of a geek. Or is the word nerd? My life and career seems to have always gravitated towards increasing use of technology and how to adapt it to my projects, life and work.

Were you at the June meeting? I decided to take advantage of Fr. O'Hare Hall's overhead projector. I worked with the parish IT guy, Ramon Aguilar (who is also a Knight) to learn the mechanics. I remember one of our Knights complaining that he could not hear

our reports. Well, if one cannot hear me, you could see my report on the big screen. Lights. Camera. Action. A picture can tell the story.

Our council is using technology on an increasing basis. Up until a few years ago, we could not take credit cards for our customers to pay for tickets to our events. Thanks to the efforts of Cliff Judd, our treasurer, we have a mini-iPad with a chip reader that allows us to take credit card purchases. This is significant – as CC purchases accounted for over 50% of our revenue at the Crab Feed.

The council now uses Constant Contact as a way of sending out our monthly newsletters and other communications. We still send a printed copy to those members who may not be computer savvy, but we need to look forward and adapt our efforts to the generations to come.

Our council's recording of expenses (vouchers) and revenue (receipts) was migrated from an old Foxpro database application to the Knights' web-based system that I can access via my computer, my iPhone or my Samsung tablet to record items or to look up information. Trust me, this is very helpful, whether using the wifi in the Parish Hall or on the road when questions arise. Technology is also a part of my home life. I have a hobby and interest that began to grow when the internet came on the scene. I created a web site. It became a resource for the history of country music. This past year, I immersed myself even further with technology to do research and wrote a couple of essays. In May 2018, two were published in the International Country Music Journal 2018.

# FATHER MARK'S MESSAGE

Dear brother Knights,  
As you know, I was honored last month to receive the Father Juan Perez Chaplain's Award. Father Perez was the friend and chaplain of Christopher Columbus and sailed with Columbus on his second expedition to the Americas. He celebrated the very first Mass in the new world. It was celebrated on December 8, 1493, which is the day of the Feast of the Immaculate Conception. The place where the Mass was celebrated was on a Caribbean Island called Hispaniola at a place which was called "Point Conception."



It is interesting to see how the dogma of the Immaculate Conception figures in the story of the discovery of the New World by Christopher Columbus. The Immaculate Conception was the patron saint of Spain and its territories, and it happened that Columbus received support from



Queen Isabella of Spain. Columbus himself was Portuguese but his friend Fr. Juan Perez was the spiritual director of Queen Isabella and facilitated an interview with her to obtain support for his journey.

When Columbus first landed on a Caribbean Island in 1492, he named the Island "San Salvador" which means "Holy Savior." Then the second Island they discovered was named "Concepcion" in honor of the patroness of Spain. The Spanish explorers were motivated to claim these new lands for Our Lord and Our Lady. Columbus was motivated to conquer the world for Christ the King and his Immaculate Mother! This should also be the goal of the Knights of Columbus! St. Maximilian Kolbe often spoke of his fellow Franciscan Friars as "knights" and he spoke of conquering the whole world "for the Immaculata." He said that the whole purpose of his "City of Mary" was that his Franciscan Friars should urgently conquer the world for Mary Immaculate: "The purpose of Marytown will always be conquering the whole world for the Immaculata as soon as possible and everything in it... Hence everyone must be ready at any moment to go anywhere without hesitation, even to the ends of the earth and to a sure death. In a word, always



and in everything: "unreservedly" for the Immaculata... The purpose of Marytown is to win all souls who are and who will be, collectively and individually, for the Immaculata, and through her for the most Sacred Heart of Jesus. This must be done as soon as possible, as soon as possible." ("Aim Higher" pp. 48-51) Mary is the mother and queen of the universe whether we like it or not. It is good for us to belong to such a good mother. And so we must continue this missionary work of St. Maximilian Kolbe and of Christopher Columbus!
