GRAND KNIGHT'S MESSAGE

After 3 years of contributing monthly updates to the Newsletter, this will be my final article. Your new officers' will carry on this tradition to keep you informed on what is happening with your Council. Before I leave office on July 1, there are still a few things that are "in the works" that we need your input on.

- The **Scholarship** Committee will present their applicants and recommendations at the June Business meeting.
- Due to everyone's hard work, this year we have a surplus of funds, and therefore some **proposals for additional donations** have been requested which will be voted on at the next business meeting, Tuesday, June 5th. The proposals are to add \$3000 to the Scholarship Fund (increasing this year's donation from \$3000 to \$6000) AND add a new donation of \$2000 to the Salvation Army's Berberian Homeless Shelter. FYI: last month we also increased our donation to the Seminarian Fund by \$500 to a total

of \$2500, to the 365 Club by \$500 to a total of \$2100 and added a donation to Leukemia Research of \$1000.

Our Columbian Year is winding down, which means June is upon us and there will be elections for new Officers. Make a point to be at the meeting and make your vote count.





God bless all of you and your families. Let us all pray for Michael Glendon and his family. I am terrible about staying up on my emails, so as I turned on my computer to compose this article on May 15, the same day that it is due, I noticed a prayer request for Michael from the 13th. It said that he was in the north tower at Memorial Hospital. That tower is directly behind my kitchen window. I immediately stopped, raised my hands to the tower, and said the Our Father and prayed to our Mother Mary for intercession for Michael and his family. I was torn. I had this dead line and poor Richard Braun, our editor, is always waiting for my articles, and here I was missing visiting hours. I was at 5:45 daily mass earlier, pulled my phone out of my pocket to turn it off, and noticed I missed a text at 5:08 that a good friend of mine from the Volkswagen car show circle of friends died in a terrible car crash in the Bay Area. At that moment, I had to shut off my phone because mass had started. I felt ill, shocked, and numb, but I just knew that he, his family, and I all needed me to be at mass, praying for him. We always need prayer. I had planned to come straight home after mass and fasting until I could complete this article. I also knew that, as usual, I had nothing about which to write. I found myself on the phone with friends that were even closer to my good friend. One friend was in bad need of consolation and was dealing with many things. I spent two hours sharing old memories and trying to celebrate a life that had ended here on earth. These friends know I am in love with the Lord Jesus Christ, but I found myself unaware of their knowledge or belief in our Lord. Of course, I always speak freely of the truth and love of our Savior though sometimes (always?) I find myself struggling for the right words.

One of the statements my friend made was, "We need to write notes every day and remind those people that we love them. We get up and go to work and never know if we are coming home to our family."

I replied, "That's very true. 'We know not the time!'"

He said, "I just don't understand why God would take him now at this time. He struggled for so long to raise his children and make his marriage work. He has a new business and was doing so well." There was that great word "GOD"! I searched for the words, but there all they are in scripture. "It is not for us to know God's plan but a greater good will come from this." "We know not the time," we must be prepared. Wow, did that come out of me? I told him, "Whatever you, do not blame God."

He said, "No, I am not mad at God, but I am just very sad for his wife and children."

Then, I got off the phone, turned on the computer to get the prayer request for Michael, and realized I had missed visiting hours. I have often wondered about my friend that I was consoling, what was his take on Jesus Christ? Maybe our mutual friend's life, memories, and sudden passing will bring him and many others to the foot of the cross. Maybe it will help me to share my faith more with courage to live life with love in my heart like there is no tomorrow. Maybe it will help my friend to write those notes to all his loved ones letting them know "I love you" or, even better, "God loves you!" Maybe my good friend will become a Catholic someday soon. Maybe he will start preparing. Maybe that's God's plan, His greater good.

I do know this: there is no time like the present to go see Michael Glendon and to pray for him. It is always the right time to pray in general! I know everyone hates group texts. Therefore, I want to take this moment and say with faith hope and courage that I love each one of you! So go see Michael and other Knights when they need us. Open those prayer requests. Write your "I love you" notes. Hug a widow and tell them how loved and important they are. Get on your phone right now and text those kids in college, that friend you have not seen in the longest time or that enemies you have not forgiven, text these simple words "I love you" pass it on - Jesus Christ did
