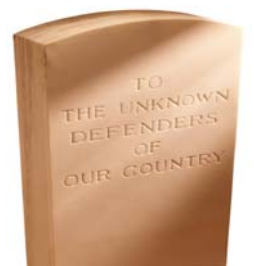

My coworker may or may not be culpable for her ignorance, but it’s the same ignorance that guides the thoughts and actions of countless Americans, Catholic or otherwise, regarding contraception, abortion or birth control and the family.



Freedom of speech and religion are not only our rights, they are also our responsibility. Our government cannot impose a particular religion upon the citizenry nor can they deny any. Yet it is moving toward penalizing the Church for not performing homosexual marriage (Prop 8), not placing children for adoption by same sex couples (Catholic Charities of San Francisco) and requiring Catholic hospitals to perform abortions and prescribe contraceptives. To forcibly diminish Catholicism from the American

landscape would be the introduction of atheism as THE government sponsored religion. And yes, atheism is a religion. Our voices or our silence will stand in judgment of our selves and our generation. Lord, have mercy on us!
