Brothers I want to wish you and your family a blessed November and a Happy Thanksgiving Day with your family and friends. May God continue to bless you always.

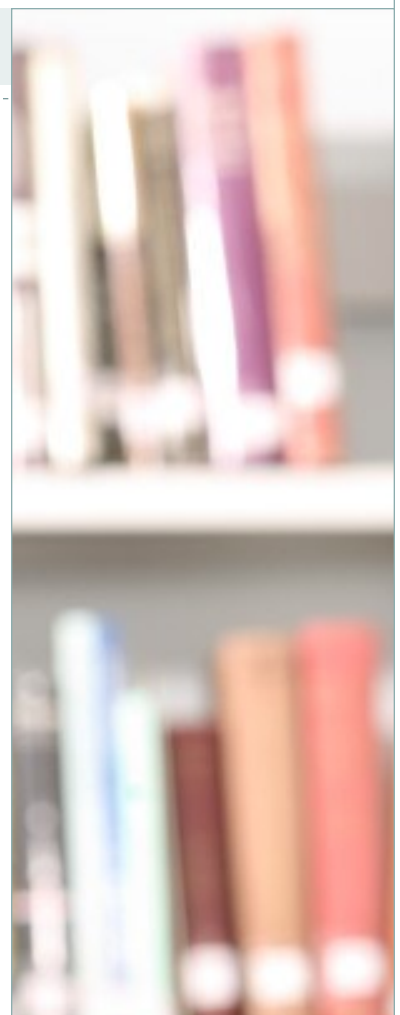

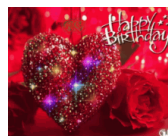

DEACON'S NOVEMBER MESSAGE

Brothers,

Three months ago, I posed a series of questions about the mass. The answers should have been easy to respond, since mass is something we go to all the time.

I am going to continue give some of the 16 answers here.

6. Towards where are we supposed to bow? And why?



To be truthful, I posed this 6th question to go in line with the next one about genuflecting, because there appears to

be some confusion about what to do and when during a mass. An online dictionary defines bowing to be "the act of lowering the torso and head as a social gesture in direction to another person or symbol." It is meant as a way of showing reference towards someone or something. The Japanese have a lot of rules regarding bowing with age, sex, authority, etc. playing a role in who bows first, how deeply they bow, and more. For the most part, in the West we do not bow. We might tilt our heads a little to say hello to another male but not much beyond that.

The referential part of bowing can even be seen in the Bible. In his letter to the Philippians, St. Paul included what many consider to be one the very first Christian hymns. You will find it in Chapter 2 beginning with verse 6 and concluding in verse 11. It talks about Jesus being in human appearance and humbling himself to the point of being obedient to death, death on a cross. It continues with: "at the name of Jesus every knee should BOW, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is

Lord." Some translations have the word bow as "bend" to make it easier to do with our knees, but most have it as "bow." The message is the same, Jesus is worthy of our reference. There are many other examples of bowing before God or Jesus in the Bible:

- 1)When the angels appear to Abraham, he bows before them.
- 2)When Joseph's brothers come to him in Egypt to ask for help, they bow before him.
- 3)When Saul comes to anoint the future King David, he bows.
- 4)Moses bows before his father-in-law.
- 5)The wise men bow down before the Christ child.

6)The leper bows down before Jesus, as does the wealthy young man who doesn't want to sell his possessions, and the woman who had been hemorrhaging for many years.

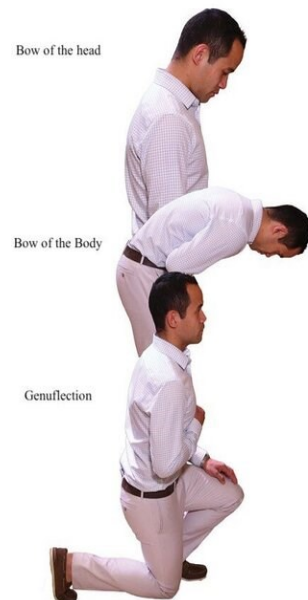
There are more, but I think you get the point. So, why would we bow in mass? Mostly for the same reason. Those of us who are really into the liturgy and the deep meaning behind it, give a slight bow of our heads every time that the name of Jesus or Mary are mentioned. Why? Because of the verses from Philippians above. "At the name of Jesus, every knee shall bow and every tongue confess . . ." The Director of Worship from the diocese says that he can always tell which priests and deacons understand liturgy, because their heads bow. It would be wonderful to see more of you from the laity understanding that deep aspect of liturgy and bowing. At the same time, you are not mandated to do so. There are times when you are

asked to bow, and it appears that many are either not aware of have forgotten.



The first time we should bow is during the Creed. At the moment

of saying "Born of the Virgen Mary and became man," we should all make a deep bow. We do so, because that is the time in which all things changed, when God became man by taking on flesh and living among us. In the older version of the mass, we would all kneel or at least genuflect at those words. Now, we should at least bow.

DEACON'S NOVEMBER MESSAGE

We are all also asked to bow every time that we pass before the altar. Why the altar? Because the altar is where Jesus is truly made present to us. You will see all priests, deacons, altar servers, and others who understand bowing each and every time that we pass in front, even to walk to the other side of the altar to do another liturgical act, such as proclaiming the Gospel. It is a way of showing reference towards what the altar is for, making present that sacrifice of Christ for our salvation.

There is another time during the mass in which we are asked to make a referential act, but it does not necessarily have to be a bow. That time is immediately before receiving communion. As we wait in line, right before it is our turn to receive, we are asked to make a sign of reference. That referential sign can be genuflecting or bowing our heads. I've seen that most people tend to bow (even though there are some who don't remember or know to do anything). There are also some that bow, genuflect, and cross themselves all at the same time. All of three are not needed. By genuflecting or bowing our heads, that is sufficient.

7. Towards where are we supposed to genuflect (bend the right knee and touching it to the ground)? And why?

This is where some confusion arises. Some people are not sure when to bow and when to genuflect. Both are signs of reference. Genuflection is a much more profound sign of reference. Because of this, it is limited to something that merits more reference, such as the presence of Jesus. As stated above, we can genuflect before receiving communion, because Jesus is truly present then. Most know that they should genuflect when they come into mass and when we are leaving, even though it seems like many are not aware of doing that or why, as they do not appear to know towards where they are genuflecting. Our genuflection should be towards the tabernacle. Why the tabernacle? That is where Jesus is present, no? That's why many of us when we enter different churches, the first thing that we look for is where the tabernacle is located. The tabernacle used to be located in the middle of the back of every church. Now, in some parishes it is there, others it is to a side, and in others the tabernacle is in a completely different room. So towards where should we genuflect? Towards wherever Jesus is present.

I can always tell when people know when to genuflect or not during the final days before Easter, on Good Friday and Holy Saturday. During those two days of the year, the tabernacle is completely empty. It is empty, because that is the time in which Jesus is either in the tomb or descended to where the dead are. So, when entering a church on those two days (or any other day in which there is a lot of cleaning and the tabernacle is left empty), there is nothing there, so there is no need to genuflect at all. There is nothing toward which to show reference. You can tell when the tabernacle is empty, because the candle will be out. On those days, people who are paying attention will bow towards the altar and not genuflect at all.

Now you know when to bow and when to genuflect and towards what. Will you remember next time that you are inside of the church? Will you be bowing to the tabernacle or genuflecting?

Next month, I will continue answering the remaining 10 questions that I posed back in August. How many of those 10 do you know the answer to? I am just an email away for you to give me your answers. Don't be afraid, even if you are not correct, it's all for fun.
